Dear Roger,

South Oxfordshire District Council comments on Binfield Heath Community Led Plan Review

Congratulations on completing the review of the Binfield Heath Community Led Plan (CLP), a few years after you completed the original parish plan in 2013. I understand that the plan review was handed over to the parish council to take forward the proposed actions, so please forward this note to the parish clerk and councilors as well as other key people involved in the development and delivery of the plan.

Undertaking a review of your original plan is a good way to celebrate what you've achieved so far, check how your actions are progressing, and maintain community enthusiasm and support. The review highlights the successes you've had and shows that many of the eight actions identified in the original plan in 2013 have been successfully completed. It also shows that the vast majority of the six activities set out have been maintained and are still ongoing. This is a credit to the community and I hope these activities are able to continue well into the future.

A copy of your community led plan review was passed to all relevant teams in the council so that officers can take account of the opinions and preferences of your whole community where appropriate. Below are responses to your plan review from teams across the council which I hope will be useful. These comments are provided to help and support you in delivering your action plan, and to support the continuing improvement of your community over the coming months and years. I understand that you were also provided with comments and guidance a few months ago so please do refer to these points as well.

Sports and leisure

Economic development

Community safety

Karen Brown, Community Safety Team Leader (karen.brown@southandvale.gov.uk or 01235 422 592) had the following advice.

Having looked at the action plan, Binfield Heath may wish to contact Thames Valley Community Rehabilitation Company (TVCRC) for assistance with litter picking, clearing verges and overgrown pathways in public spaces. TVCRC arrange for offenders who have been given Community Payback sentences, community placements whereby they give back to communities. If this is of interest they can contact Diane Major on 01869 328 500 for more information. All offenders are supervised by a member of the TVCRC.

Planning

Planning matters are a key focus of the CLP review and I understand that you have already contacted the planning policy team to discuss neighbourhood planning. With this in mind I wanted to add a reference from the 'neighbourhood plan or community led plan?' guide produced by the council which summarises the differences between neighbourhood plans and community led plans. I understand you've been provided this before but thought it was worth including here that with regards to planning the guide states that:

Neighbourhood plans are made part of the district's development plan following examination and referendum, which gives it considerable weight in determining planning applications.

A CLP has no formal weight, although it can be taken into account in determining planning applications if it covers issues that are material planning considerations. A CLP is useful in giving a community perspective on issues such as preferred sites, but it could not be used to justify refusing or granting planning permission.
