## Neighbourhood Plan consultation

The parish council (PC) is consulting all parishioners on whether to create a Neighbourhood Plan (NP). The council cannot hold a public meeting because of Covid-19 regulations. In order to reach as many people as possible, the council has used emails where known and also posted paper copies. They would appreciate your views in order to gauge the level of support among parishioners.

To create the plan, there will need to be a steering group comprising councillors and residents, supported by working parties to look after specific topic areas. Please read the document when you receive it. This is a serious undertaking and needs a commitment from both the PC and the community. You are recommended to take a look before responding to the consultation. Your answers to the questions will be immensely useful and do not commit you to anything at this stage. Please respond, online or on a paper copy dropped into the shop, by March 31 – anonymously if you prefer. The PC really needs to hear your opinion.

## **A Window for Wilfred**

---

You may have already been contacted regarding the latest Wilfred Owen project to install a memorial window in All Saints Church, Dunsden and probably received a leaflet with your Christmas greetings from the Church Benefice. The Dunsden Owen Association have just set up a crowdfunding page <https://www.crowdfunder.co.uk/stained-glass-window-for-wilfred-owen> to publicise what they are doing and to raise necessary funds.

The celebrated WW1 poet lived in Dunsden as a young man. He was strongly influenced by his 18 months here, as he came face to face with the poverty, disease and injustice suffered by local people. This social concern carried over into his care and interest in the soldiers, who fought alongside him in WW1. We are very keen therefore that the local community should have a direct stake in the window, so we are appealing to local residents.
