Sarah is happy to deliver reasonable car boot loads to those who are self-isolating. They can place their order either online or by calling Sarah at home on 0118 9483550. Either way, you will then receive a call from a member of TH staff (but not Sarah) to confirm availability, prices etc. and take payment. You can either request delivery by Sarah at the time of ordering or at the time of payment. Delivery via Sarah is likely to be quicker than via TH van.

Social distancing and walks

The general rule is that walkers should walk on the right hand side of the road facing oncoming traffic. Currently many people are walking on the left and although it is perhaps not as dangerous with the current reduced levels of traffic, it does make maintaining social distancing a bit more difficult.

It may be that some people are unaware of this or may have forgotten, but the guidelines are:

If there is no pavement, keep to the right-hand side of the road so that you can see oncoming traffic. You should take extra care and be prepared to walk in single file, especially on narrow roads or in poor light keep close to the

side of the road. It may be safer to cross the road well before a sharp right-hand bend so that oncoming traffic has a better chance of seeing you. Cross back after the bend.

Parish of Eye & Dunsden

Steps are being taken to complete the Neighbourhood Development Plan (NDP) eyedunsden.org/plan/, which is one way residents can protect and enhance the Parish for the benefit of all. Please do get involved!

Two key activities are progressing well:

- A £5,000 grant has been given by SODC and it is hoped that match funding will be gained from Eye & Dunsden and more funding from central government. It will allow for experts and planning specialists to be hired to complete much of the research and analysis required.
- A short initial survey will be sent to all Parish residents during May asking for feedback on issues most important to people; this will enable the NDP subcommittee to direct resources to develop recommendations that address the majority of residents' issues. The survey can be completed on paper, scanned and emailed; or online. It is hoped the majority of households will complete the survey only 4 questions and takes no more than 5 mins to complete. The deadline for completion is 30 May.
